Woodstone Country Club Dress Code

All members, their family and their guests are expected to wear proper attire befitting the surroundings and atmosphere provided in the settings of the Club. It is also expected that members will advise their guests as to the dress requirements of the club. Proper attire is required always. Members and their guests are to always follow the Woodstone Dress Code.

DRESS CODE

- Shirts and shoes must be worn always
- Metal spiked shoes are not permitted on club premises
- Men's shirts must have a collar (mock style is acceptable)
- Shirts must be tucked in
- Women's shirts must have a collar and/or sleeves, no tank tops
- No midriff should be showing
- All shorts must be Bermuda length
- Hats should be worn in the correct forward facing fashion

The following apparel is unacceptable:

- Running shorts, basketball shorts, cut-offs
- Halter tops
- Tennis or swimming attire
- Tee shirts or tank tops
- Blue jeans or blue denim
- Athletic sweat suits including football/other athletic jerseys
- Any type of garment with any offensive printed phrases or slogans
- Baseball caps worn in anything other than a forward-facing style

It is the responsibility of the member to inform children and guests of the proper dress code. The staff reserves the right to refuse golfing or dining privileges to anyone not properly attired.

Woodstone Country Club Pace of Play Policy

Pace of Play is an industry issue and our number one goal while you are playing your round of golf. For the enjoyment of everyone, members and guests are expected to play in a timely manner and to not unduly delay play. The expected and encouraged pace of play at Woodstone is *2 hours or less* for 9 holes and *4 hours or less* for 18 holes with a maximum time of 2:10 for 9 holes and 4:20 for 18 holes. Anyone not adhering to this time limit may be asked to speed up or in severe cases skip holes.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- **ALL** Reservations **MUST** be made through the home club's golf shop by the professional staff.
- Full golfing members of the clubs above will be allowed to play at any of the other clubs for a cart/range fee of \$40. Most clubs require payment on site by cash or credit card.
- Tee times may be made 7 days in advance for weekdays and the Thursday prior for weekends. Each club has the right to determine what tee times are available and are encourage to allow afternoon play on the weekends.
- Riding carts or caddies are mandatory.
- The dress code of the host club must be observed by all guests in the clubhouse and on the course. Soft spikes are mandatory at all clubs.
- Members have the option of inviting outside guests who are not members of any of the participating clubs. These guests would be billed the host club's normal guest greens fee.
- Most clubs do not charge back so we encourage you to pay at the time of play.
- It is requested that no one be allowed to play more than (3) times per year at any one club as part of this program.
- Visiting members and guests are encouraged to patronize the other services provided at the club including the locker room, dining facilities and outside services. You are also encouraged to give an appropriate gratuity for any services.

Golf Rules & Regulations

It is the intention of Club Management to maximize the enjoyment of all members of the Club and their families and guests in their use and enjoyment of the golf course, practice ranges and other golf related facilities. The care, maintenance and condition of the Club's golf course, practice range, and other golf facilities, dictate that the following rules and regulations be observed always.

CONTROL OF PLAY

The use of and play on the Club's golf course and practice range shall always be subject to the control of the Club's Golf Professional and his designated professional staff. The Golf Course Superintendent, in consultation with the Golf Professional, shall determine when weather or other conditions dictate the closing of the course or the prohibition of or the imposition of limitations upon the use of golf carts.

Upon being accepted as a member and prior to playing, all new members must meet with the Golf Professional to familiarize themselves with Woodstone Membership Rules and Regulations, local rules, golf etiquette, etc. Members must have an official handicap based on minimum of five rounds at Woodstone before they are eligible to participate in any Club event, Association event, or tournament.

STARTING TIMES

Starting times may be obtained 8 days in advance at 6 pm. on the mobile app or by calling the Golf Shop at 610-760-2777 or by being present at the Golf Shop.

STARTING PLAY

All members and guests shall register in the Golf Shop before teeing off.
Players starting at a tee other than number one must get permission from the Golf Shop.

GUESTS

Members of the Club may sponsor and entertain guests at the Club subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Club. Each member of the Club shall be responsible for the conduct, dress, guest fees and other charges of his or her guest, or the guest of the members of his or her family. Members may bring the same guest a maximum of 4 times a year. Guests playing in club events with a member to not count toward their 4 rounds.

ELECTRIC GOLF CARTS

The following Rules and Regulations shall govern the use of electric golf carts on the golf course and elsewhere on Club premises.

- The use and operation of all golf carts is at the risk of the users and operators. Members shall be responsible and personally liable to the Club for the cost of all repairs and/or damage to Club owned golf carts caused by themselves, members of their family or their guests as well as for any personal injury or property damage occasioned by the negligent operation of a golf cart by themselves, members of their family or their guests. Members over sixteen (16) years of age holding a valid driver's license may operate a golf cart on Club premises at any time.

GUIDELINES ON USE OF ELECTRIC CARTS

- Club owned golf carts are only for use on the golf course and for transportation to and from the practice range. No more than two (2) people and two (2) golf bags may occupy or be carried in or on a single golf cart at any one time.
- Golf carts must be used and operated always in such manner as not to damage the golf course or other Club property. Carts must be operated on cart paths where provided and in no event, shall golf carts be driven nearer than fifty (50) feet to any green or twenty-five (25) feet to any tee except on an established cart path located within those prescribed distances. Golf carts are not permitted to be driven in or through any sand traps, bunkers or other hazards and shall be kept at least ten (10) feet from the lip or edge of any sand traps, bunkers or hazards. Carts must be parked on the side or rear, and never in front, of any green. Considerable playing time will be saved and possible injury avoided with the observation of this rule. Soft areas on fairways, depressions and drainage retention areas must be avoided, especially after heavy rains. All directional signs, ropes and other markers used to guide and direct golf cart traffic must be observed. Similarly, signs prohibiting or restricting the use of golf carts in an area are to be obeyed without exception.

PLAYING PRIORITY

Threesomes and foursomes shall have priority in playing and privileges at all times. Groups larger than foursomes must be authorized by the Golf Staff and must not hold up speed of play. Singles shall have no priority on the golf course.

SLOW PLAY

Slow play is not in the interest of the game of golf and is detrimental to the enjoyment of the game by the membership of the Club, their families and their guests. "Slow Play" shall mean and be defined as a foursome or a group of lesser size taking over four (4) hours to complete a round of eighteen (18) holes, and two (2) hours to complete a round of nine (9) holes or if they have an open hole in front of them. All players are encouraged to report instances of slow play to the Golf Staff and they should not consider themselves nor do others consider those reporting slow play to be anything but guardians of the game of golf and the rights and privileges of Club membership.

MAKING THE TURN

Players stopping or pausing for food and beverages or for any other reason following the completion of play at No. 9 and before commencement of play on number 10 may not delay the following groups and the stopping or pausing players are required to invite the following group to play through to maintain continuity of play.

CLEARING SHOTS

Each player should be prepared to make his or her shot when it is his or her turn to play, and all players shall be certain that the foursome ahead is well clear of the green or otherwise out of range before playing any shot.

REPLACING DIVOTS

Following each shot, players shall see that any divot cut turf displaced by them is replaced and firmly pressed down immediately and/or fill divot cuts with sand provided by the Club.

SMOOTHING BUNKERS

Players shall see that all footprints and divots made by them in bunkers are raked or otherwise smoothed out

REPAIRING BALL MARKS

Each player shall be responsible for repairing any ball mark made by his or her shot on a putting green. All players shall repair any such ball marks observed by them whether made by their shots.

CLEARING GREEN

When play of a hole has been completed or the result of the hole otherwise determined, the flagstick shall be promptly returned to the hole and the players shall immediately clear and leave the putting green and proceed to the next tee without delay. Scoring for the completed hole should be accomplished at the next tee while others are playing tee shots.

GOLF COURSE ETIQUETTE

Customary golf course etiquette shall be observed always. Players shall not disturb players in their own or other foursomes. Loud talk, profane language and unnecessary noise or movement shall not be allowed, especially where tees and greens are near. Occupied tees shall not be approached in such a manner that will disturb players.

TEES

Members need to select a default tee. Men may select the Oak or Maple and Ladies the Pine or Cedar. This will be the tee that the member will play for all member events. You are expected to play a majority of your rounds from the tee. Tee selection is based on any of the following - (age, driving distance, handicap and most importantly enjoyment of the game.)

SCORES

Scores for all (9) and (18) hole rounds, including tournament rounds, played at the Club must be posted on GHIN. Should the Golf Staff determine that a member has violated this rule that shall arbitrarily assign to the violating player a score which is two (2) strokes lower than the lowest of the last twenty (20) scores turned in by or for such member.



HANDICAPS

Member handicaps shall be computed in accordance with current United States Golf Association recommendations and requirements under the supervision of the Golf Professional. The Golf Staff shall review all handicaps from time to time and adjust any handicaps which it deems to be inappropriate.

TOURNAMENTS

Member handicaps shall be computed in accordance with current United States Golf Association Rules. All golf tournament play at the Club shall be governed by the United States Golf Association Rules, except as modified or super ceded by local rules of the Club. Local rules of the Club shall be printed on Club score cards and/or posted on Club bulletin boards in the locker rooms and Golf Shop. Each player shall play in strict accordance with such rules. Any player found to be in violation of such rules and who, as a result thereof, shall report a false or inaccurate score may be barred from tournament play at the Club and/or have his or her playing privileges at the Club suspended by Club Management.

PRACTICE

Practice is not permitted on the golf course or onto any of its greens or in any of its bunkers or hazards. The Club practice range and practice putting greens must be used for practice. Range balls provided by the Club Professional must be used on the practice range always. The practice range shall be open during such hours as shall be determined by the Golf Professional and Golf Course Superintendent from time to time. Use of the practice range at all other hours is prohibited.

RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF GOLF COURSE

The golf course is to be used exclusively for the game of golf and is not to be used as a playground by members, their children, or their guests. Children playing golf on the course must be accompanied by an adult.

Woodstone Membership Rules Et Regulations

OWNERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

Woodstone, hereinafter referred to as the "Club" is privately owned. The ownership shall have exclusive control over the operation and management of the Club, its property and facilities and shall establish and control all membership policies, rules and regulations of the Club. The Club reserves the right, in its sole and absolute discretion, to amend or waive these Rules and Regulations, to discontinue operation of any or all the Club facilities or to sell or otherwise dispose of the Club facilities in any manner whatsoever and to any person whomsoever.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF MEMBERSHIP RIGHTS

A membership is not an investment in the Club, nor does it provide an equity or ownership interest in the Club or the Club facilities which are solely by the Club. The payment of the initiation fees, dues, all taxes, service charges and personal and other charges as the Club may establish from time to time, (collectively "membership charges") are not subject to any liability or assessment for the costs and expenses of ownership or management of the Club or the Club facilities. No member of the Club shall by such membership incur any liability or responsibility or any debts or obligations of the Club, the owner, or the Club Management. Each member shall have personal liability and responsibility for and the obligation to pay all applicable initiation fees, dues, charges and other fees attendant to membership in the Club or made for the use and enjoyment of Club property, facilities and services or for participation in Club programs and activities.

RESIGNATION

Any member who wish to terminate his or her membership must give a 30-day written notice. However, the member is responsible for initiation fees, membership dues, charges, including, without limitation, guest fees, cart fees, club storage fees and service charges. If you can provide us with a new member at the time of resignation, we will waive the last month's dues.

TERMINATION

Should any member resign, be expelled, not have his or her membership renewed or otherwise cease to be a member of the Club, the rights and privileges of such member of the Club or member's family to use and enjoy the Club properties, facilities, programs and activities shall immediately cease and terminate.

Upon any such termination of membership neither the initiation fee nor any dues paid by such terminating or terminated member shall be repaid or refunded either in whole or in part.

REINSTATEMENT

Club Management may reinstate a former member who, having resigned, been expelled or not had his previous membership renewed, desires reinstatement to membership. Reinstatement shall be in writing and shall accurately set forth the circumstances of the previous termination of his or her membership and the reasons for the requested reinstatement.

DEATH OF A MEMBER

In the event of the death of a member of the Club, the surviving spouse of such member, shall automatically succeed to the membership previously held by the deceased member without the payment of any initiation fee or other charges for such transfer of membership; provided, however, that the account of the deceased member of the Club is first fully paid.

ESTABLISHMENT OF DUES & CHARGES

The amount of all initiation fees, membership dues and other fees and charges, including, without limitation, guest fees, cart fees, club storage fees and service charges, shall be determined and established by Club Management.

TAXES

All Club dues, fees and other charges shall be subject to all applicable sales, use, transaction and other taxes imposed from time to time under and pursuant to local, state and federal laws and ordinances.



MEMBERSHIP DUES

Membership dues shall be charged monthly.

MEMBERSHIP ACCOUNTS

Each member of the Club shall be assigned a membership account number. All purchases made or services rendered shall be charged to the account of such member. All purchases on Club premises shall be made by the execution by the purchaser of a charge ticket or chit and the subscription thereon on his or her name, the name of the member and the number of the membership account to which such purchase is to be charged. A member may authorize others than his or her spouse and qualifying children to charge purchases made at the Club to his or her account by prior written notification to Club Management.

PERSONAL LIABILITY

Each member shall be personally liable and responsible to the Club for all purchases charged to his or her membership account, whether made by himself or herself, his or her spouse, his or her qualifying children or his or her authorized guests, and for all initiation and other fees, dues and other charges made or accruing to his or her account.

STATEMENTS

An itemized statement shall be rendered by Club Management to each member on or before the tenth (10th) day of each month setting forth all purchases charged to his or her membership account during the previous month and setting forth such dues, fees or other charges payable by such member or otherwise charged or accruing to his or her membership account.

ERRORS

Each member shall be responsible for determining the accuracy of all statements rendered on his or her membership account and informing Club Management of any errors reflected therein. Errors must be reported to and discussed with Club Management within ten (10) days of a member's receipt of his or her monthly statement

PAYMENT & DELINQUENCY

An itemized statement shall be rendered by Club Management to each member on or before the tenth (10th) day of each month setting forth all purchases charged to his or her membership account during the previous month and setting forth such dues, fees or other charges payable by such member or otherwise charged or accruing to his or her membership account.

DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS: SUSPENSION

If full payment of a statement of a member's account is not be made within forty five (45) days of the date of its rendition, the right and privileges of membership of such member and his family to use Club property and the facilities shall automatically be suspended until such time as all indebtedness, including dues, fees and other charges and all interest due on or under his or her membership account since the rendition of the delinquent statement shall be paid in full.

DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS: EXPULSION

Should a suspended member's delinquent account, including any dues, fees and other charges and all interest accrued on or under his or her membership account since the rendition of the delinquent statement, not be paid within sixty (60) days of the date of its rendition, Club Management shall be entitled to expel such member from the Club at any time thereafter.

DELINQUENT ACCOUNTS: COLLECTION

A delinquent account may be referred to the Magistrate or attorney for the institution of such legal proceedings as may be required for such collection. The member shall be responsible and liable to the Club for payment of all attorney's fees, expenses and court costs associated with such collection, whether any such legal proceedings are instituted.

Woodstone House Rules

HOURS OF OPERATION

The Golf Club will be open Tuesday through Sunday. Members may not use any Club facility or property when the Club is closed.

USE OF CLUB FACILITIES BY OTHERS

From time to time, Management may permit use of the Club facilities by non-members or groups of non-members if such use will not unreasonably restrict the enjoyment of the Club by its members.

ATTIRE

All members and guests are expected to wear proper casual attire always. Collared shirts, Mach Turtle are permitted on the golf course, however no jeans are allowed. Shirts and shoes must be worn always.

ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

The Club shall observe all laws of the State of Pennsylvania concerning the sale and consumption of alcoholic beverages. Accordingly, alcoholic beverages will not be served, sold, nor permitted to be consumed on Club premises during hours prohibited by law. Similarly, alcoholic beverages will not be sold or served to any person who is not permitted to purchase the same under the laws of the State of Pennsylvania, including anyone who is under twenty-one (21) years of age or anyone who, in the judgment of Club Management, is intoxicated; nor shall any alcoholic beverages be sold or served for off premises consumption. All alcoholic beverages consumed or otherwise possessed on Club premises must be sold by and purchased at the Club. Accordingly, neither member, nor any member of his or her family, nor any guest shall be permitted to possess or store beer, wine or liquor in his or her locker, or elsewhere on Club premises.

CONDUCT SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Any member of the Club or member of his or her family or guests shall be subject to disciplinary action to be determined by Club Management for any of the following reasons:

- Conduct which is prejudicial to the good order, harmony, reputation, health, safety, morals, or general welfare of the Club or its member's families.
- Conduct which is disruptive, abusive, incompatible with or offensive or disagreeable to the members of the Club, their families and guests.
- Conduct which is abusive to Club Management or its staff or other Employees.
- Conduct which, is lewd or vulgar, including the excessive use of profane or foul language, or which constitutes or evidences habitual or repeated drunkenness or which constitutes or evidences the habitual or abusive use of drugs or controlled substances.
- The violation of any Rules and Regulations of the Club including without limitation these Membership Rules and Regulations, and House Rules and any other Rules and Regulations promulgated by Club Management from time to time governing member conduct and use of Club property or facilities.
- The non-payment of any fees, dues, charges or other indebtedness due and owing to the Club, all of which shall be deemed to be "conduct unbecoming a member of the Club."

STAFF & EMPLOYEE DISCIPLINE

Matters of staff and employee discipline are sole responsibility of Club Management.

No member of the Club or any member of his or her family or guests shall be permitted to reprimand, discipline or abuse, verbally or otherwise, any staff member or employee of the Club.

Complaints regarding the conduct of any staff member or employee of the Club, including their failure to render prompt, courteous and otherwise satisfactory service, should be reported to Club Management immediately. If possible, such complaints should be in writing. However, all proper complaints involving unsatisfactory service by or the demeanor of any staff member or employee of the Club will receive the prompt attention of Club Management. It must be kept in mind, however, that Club members are not permitted to request from any staff member or employee of the Club, and Staff members and employees of the Club are not permitted to render, any special personal services which are not to be reasonably expected of them in the performance of their customary duties, nor are any Club members permitted to send or request that any staff member or employee of the Club be sent anywhere outside the Club.

STAFF & EMPLOYEE DISCIPLINE

Suggestions and complaints for the improvement of Club facilities, services and activities are welcomed and solicited by Club Management. All suggestions, criticisms or complaints should be made in writing, addressed to Club Management and signed by the author. Every effort will be made by Club Management to give immediate attention to and to objectively consider and act upon all appropriate suggestions, criticisms and complaints.
